



# INDIA

# Sail on the Ganges






## Wildlife and Adventure





#### Old Delhi by Rickshaw






#### The Markets of Mattancherry

# Plantation with a Purpose



### Monastic Music

### Mask Making


In Bhutan, mask dances are a deeply spiritual affair. Monks and locals dress up with elaborately painted masks and perform in the valley as part of their religious tradition. The masks may represent fearsome male or female protective dietities, animals, skulls, saints, sages, and legendary personages. Meet with a local artisan whose family has been making traditional wooden masks for generations. Learn about the complex process, the representation, and the skillful carving of contours and ornaments.

### Blessing Ceremony

Visit one of the oldest monasteries in Bhutan where monks learn Lamaism and astrology based on Buddhist philosophy. Sodha Travel will organize a private puja (prayer ceremony) with the monks for peace, prosperity, and good luck. An offering will be made with butter lamps at the altar while the main priest (lama) of the monastery will chant and offer blessings with a traditional scarf.







### Wildlife



### Remote Trails



### High in the Himalayas



### Barauli Community Homestay



# Hill Tribe Villages


Journey into the highlands and experience several hill tribe villages. Start with the Hmong, whose ancestors migrated from China. Meet with the elders and learn about the complex history and migration across Southeast Asia. Continue to Baan Tong Luang and the Long-Necked Karen hill tribe. The women are known for wearing numerous brass rings around their neck, creating the affectionate nickname Giraffe Neck. Nearby are the Lahu and Palong hill tribe villages where women accessorize with Rattan Rings around their waists. We invite you to engage with the locals and learn about their Burmese customs.



# Jewels of Khao Sok

Cheow Lan Lake is tucked away in Khao Sok National Park, one of the oldest rainforests in the world. Emerging from the emerald waters are limestone karsts, traces of a coral reef system that once stretched from Borneo to China. Cruise the klongs (waterways) on a traditional long-tail boat for spectacular sunset views. Cocktail optional. Transfer to your luxury tent where you drift to sleep with the music of the jungle.





# Phang Nga Bay by Starlight

Transfer to the pier for kayaking inside Phang Nga Bay with marine limestone karst islands, macaques, water monitors, kingfishers, and sea eagles. Sit back and be guided through caves on a single or double occupancy kayak. When darkness falls, the stars shine overhead in the circle of black night, fireflies flash in the cliffside jungle, and the sea glows with phosphorescence. Enjoy a spiritual ceremony with your own Krathong before boarding the escort boat back to land. A truly magical experience and a National Geographic Top 50!

# Morning Alms

In Buddhism, giving good = receiving good. Many locals start their day by giving alms (money, food, or other donations) to the monks. Rise and shine for an ancient ritual performed as the rays of the morning sun pierce the darkness of the previous night. Join the monks as they collect daily alms in the temple district. With exclusive permission by the resident monks, you will have the rare opportunity to perform the duties of a "temple boy" and then share in the morning meal. A uniquely enlightening experience!






# VIETNAM

mountain ranges.


The Vietnamese culture has evolved on the basis of the wet rice civilization, and the local lifestyle is closely related to its villages and native lands.

The diversity of the 54 ethnic groups is apparent in the many traditional and cultural treasures. Popular destinations include the dazzling capital of Hanoi, French colonial landmarks in Ho Chi Minh City, colorful streets of Hoi An, terraced highlands of Sapa, and the limestone pillars of Ha Long Bay.

# Reaching the Summit

Established as a hill station by the French in 1922, Sapa has dramatic scenery and overlooks the terraced rice fields of the Muong Hoa Valley. It used to take travelers two days of intense trekking to reach Fansipan, the highest peak in Indochina, Now it takes only 15 minutes by cable-car. Before reaching the summit, arrive at a peaceful garden complex with stone paths, ancient Azalea trees, and skillfully sculpted bronze statues. These sculptures lead the way to a celestial Buddha statue perched on the mountainside -- the largest in the country. The cloud formations at the top of Mt. Fansipan change every few seconds, revealing new shapes and scenes as the earth meets the sky.

# Vespa by Night

Experience the nightlife of Saigon from a vintage Vespa! Throughout the night, sample a variety of food and drinks at local restaurants. Zoom past the famous must-see sights of Ho Chi Minh City in the bustling traffic. You will visit a traditional coffee shop with live music and then wrap up the evening at an exciting music bar where the new generation of Vietnamese unwind and flaunt their unique styles. # The Imperial Countryside

# LAOS

Saffron-robed monks, emerald covered hills, and an abundance of wildlife await in Laos. It is a destination untouched by mass tourism. The landlocked mountainous nation features misty mountains, beautiful French colonial towns, and Buddhist stupas.


Golden temple spires rise against a backdrop of karst mountains while vibrant markets rouse sleepy river towns. With an estimated population of nearly 7 million, Laos is one of the most sparsely populated countries in Asia. Natural landmarks include the Annamite Mountains close to the border with Vietnam, as well as the Mekong River, which flows from China and along the border with Thailand. Laos is also emerging as a leader in ecotourism. Protected areas blanket the landscape and community-based projects abound to preserve both communities and the environment.

# Meditation and Mindfulness

Enter a world of health and wellness where there is a deeper connection to mind, body, and spirit. Start your day with a guided meditation at a local temple. A monk will then recite stories that connect Laos' spiritual heritage and Buddhist traditions. Continue to a holistic wellness center where a custom spa menu will be designed to show how there are many paths to balance, depending on individual patterns and behaviors. Complete the day with medicinal tea and aromatherapy.

## Lotus Art

The lotus is a sacred flower in Buddhism and a symbol of both compassion and the highest state of consciousness. Many aspects of the Buddhist path are captured in the Lotus: it grows from the mud (samsara), it is unstained and appears clean on the surface (purification,) and in the end produces a beautiful flower (enlightenment). Skip the canvas and create your own lotus leaf painting with a local artist.







# Jungle Discovery

Join our naturalist for a trek in Nam Ha, a national protected area that is home to ethnic groups and diverse plant and animal species. Explore hidden trails that lead to panoramic vistas and remote villages while listening to the soundtrack of the jungle. It's not where you travel but how you travel, and your participation supports local conservation programs.

# Boats and Buddhism

Cruise down the Mekong River on a private sailing. Sip on fresh pomegranate juice or a cocktail as you drift by riverside villages, waterfalls, and the emerald green hills. Meet with a tribal guide to explore the Pak Ou Caves, packed with over 4,000 Buddha icons. With a history dating back thousands of years, the caves are nestled in a dramatic limestone cliff at the point where the Mekong joins the Nam Ou River.









Cambodia is the successor state to the mighty Khmer empire that once ruled vast swathes of land across present-day Laos, Thailand, and Vietnam.

Cambodia's two dominant topographical features are the Mekong River and Tonle Sap Lake, and most travelers include a visit to the fabled temples of Angkor.

This complex and charming kingdom is a fusion of tribal villages, a contemporary art scene, and wonders of the world. After struggling through years of political instability, the resilient spirit of the locals casts an optimism that permeates the landscape.

## Street Art


